



Criteria

- 1. Plans to pursue a business related career
- 2. Legal residency of Cumberland, Dauphin or Perry County
- 3. Attendance at a school of higher education as a full-time student
- 4. Academic achievement, with a minimum GPA of 2.5 or higher
- 5. Commitment to community and demonstrated leadership qualities
- 6. Extracurricular activities, including employment and/or volunteering
- 7. Financial need
- 8. Essay
- Supplemental documents. This may include a resume, letter(s)
 of recommendation, transcript, FAFSA Student Aid Report (SAR),
 or other scholarship-specific documents. Specific requirements
 are noted in the application.

Essay

Describe your current interests and activities, as well as sharing future goals and ambitions. 300 words maximum.

Renewability

Recipients of this scholarship may reapply for one additional consecutive year. Students who reapply must submit a full application but will be prompted to answer a different essay question.

APPLICATION BEST PRACTICES – For Students

- Utilize the "Extenuating Circumstances" question on the application.
 This could be any circumstantial information as to why you need financial assistance.
 Examples: paying for your own college, two kids in college, parent lost job.
- Answer the essay prompt, do not use a canned, generic response.
- Connect with the scholarship donor's intent. Research the donor's intentions, their mission, who they employ, what type of student are they looking for, etc.

COMMON DENIAL REASONS

- Financial need
 - Other grants/scholarships
 - Extenuating circumstances?
- Pay attention to the eligibility criteria
 - Residency
 - Location of college
 - Type of major
- Be careful and smart about the language you use to present your financial situation



SCHOLARSHIP MATCHING OPPORTUNITY

PHEAA PATH Program

- TFEC is a PATH participating organization
- TFEC scholarship recipients are eligible to have their awards matched up to \$3,500
- Award recipient information is submitted to PHEAA by TFEC staff

PATH Eligibility Criteria – TFEC scholarship recipients are eligible if they meet the following criteria:

- Enrolled in an approved Pennsylvania college or career school
- Enrolled as an undergraduate student on at least a half-time basis
- Pennsylvania state grant recipient
- Demonstrate financial need

PATH Match – Each match provides last dollar support for tuition and fees. Scholarship funds used for reimbursement of textbook purchases are not eligible for a PATH program match.

Big 33 Academic Scholarship

- Open to students in PA who are planning to attend a technical school or accredited college or university following high school graduation.
- Eligible students must maintain a grade point average of 2.0 during their sophomore and junior year of high school.
- Students must be high school seniors at a public or private school in PA.
- Students should exhibit such traits as academic achievement, community service, financial need, leadership, obstacles overcome, special talents, and unique endeavors.

Scholarship Application Tips

Scholarship Tips -Start Early

- Search early
- Get involved
 - Volunteer
 - Clubs, organizations, part-time jobs, etc.
- Build & protect your "brand"
 - Clean up social media accounts
 - Create professional email account
- Create folder/location to store scholarship/postsecondary information
 - Letters of recommendation letters
 - Test scores, class rank, etc.
 - Transcript request forms




Scholarship Resume

Create a Resume

- Academics Honor/AP courses, grades, GPA, class rank, test scores
- Personal / Performance sports,
 music, art, leadership, achievements
- Extra Curricular Activities jobs, hobbies
- Volunteerism, Community Activities, Employment

What makes you stand out?

Besides grades, class rank, test scores



The Essay

- Don't like scholarships with essays? Do them anyway!
 - Give yourself adequate time to draft a solid essay
 - Recycle your essays
- If given a specific topic/question, stay on track
 - Answer the question(s) being asked
 - Reflect on a personal story
 - Include details that help you stand out from others
- No need to repeat what is already collected on the application
- Proofread before submitting
 - Ask a reliable source to proofread (teacher, parent, etc.)
 - Did I say proofread?!
- Follow instructions
 - Word count
 - Font size, spacing, etc.



Common Scholarship Essay Questions

- Why do you deserve this scholarship?
- Describe a time you demonstrated leadership.
- What person do you admire the most?
 Why?
- Where do you see yourself in ten years from now?
- Describe a challenge you have overcome.

Letters of Recommendation

Some scholarship applications will ask applicants to submit one or more letters of recommendation along with the completed scholarship application.

- Choose the right person to write the letter Don't ask family or friends
- Don't wait until the last minute -give them plenty of time
- Give the writer everything that they need
- Say thank you

Build a Scholarship Toolbox



- Letters of recommendation from teachers, mentors, employers (give adequate notice and copy of scholarship applying for)
- Proof of Volunteer/Community
 Service hours
- Know where to get class rank and current GPA
- Know your SAT or ACT scores
- File your FAFSA and have a copy of your Student Aid Report (for scholarships based on financial need)
- Copy of essays written
- Checklist



Be Careful of Scams

It might be a scam if...

- You must pay a fee, provide your credit card number or bank information to apply for the scholarship
- The offer doesn't include any contact information from the organization, such as a valid email address, phone number, and mailing address (a P.O. Box doesn't count).
- You never applied for the scholarship, but you receive a notice that you are the lucky winner
- The offer is filled with typos and spelling errors. For example, "scholarship" is spelled "scholrship"
- What to do if you believe you were a victim:
 - » Contact the Federal Trade Center at ReportFraud.ftc.gov
 - » Contact your financial institutions & credit card providers, if necessary

Questions to ask regarding Scholarship Awards

Is there a maximum amount of money I can receive?

- Check with the schools regarding their policies
 - Some allow scholarships to be stacked
 - Some reduce internal scholarships
 - Act 55 prohibits public schools in PA from reducing aid

How will I receive the money?

- Check with the scholarship organizations
 - Paid directly to the student
 - Paid to the school
 - Make sure all required documentation has been turned in



Scholarship Tipsheet



Scholarship Tips

Scholarships, unlike student loans, don't have to be repaid and can reduce the cost of college. The more free money (from scholarships and grants) that you find to help pay for college, the less you'll have to borrow.



Eligibility

Students who apply for scholarships must meet specific eligibility requirements and will be competing against other applicants. Scholarship eligibility may be based on any combination of criteria, including:

- · Residency (state, county, or town in which the student lives)
- Affiliation with community or religious organizations
- Extracurricular activities, including community service or clubs
- · Degree program, major, or field of study
- Financial need
- Essays
- · Academic, athletic, or artistic achievement
- Letters of recommendation



Searching

Many high school students begin searching for scholarships during their junior year. However, there are scholarship opportunities for younger students, as well as current college students. Scholarship information is available from these resources:

- High school website
- High school counselor's office or online portal
- Local library
- College or university
- National scholarship search sites (examples listed on the back)



Applying

To apply for scholarships:

- Determine that all eligibility requirements are met.
- Submit all required application materials by the deadline.
- Find out if applicants are notified of the results.



Q. What is a merit scholarship?

A. Colleges are increasingly offering merit scholarships—and not just for academic achievement or athletic skill. Schools may offer merit scholarships to attract diverse groups of students from states not highly represented at the school, or students with talents or circumstances that few others at the school have. Check with admissions offices at schools you're applying to and ask if they offer merit aid.

Q. Should students pay a company to find scholarships?

A. Students and families need to know that some scholarship offers are not what they seem. You can avoid getting scammed by ignoring offers that require you to attend a "free" seminar, pay a "small fee," or provide a credit card number.

Q. Will scholarships affect other sources of financial aid?

A. Scholarships from outside sources may affect other financial aid. By filling unmet need, scholarships may reduce the amount a family has to pay out-of-pocket or they may reduce loans, work-study, or grant aid. Check with your school's financial aid office to find out how outside scholarships may affect your financial aid offer.

Q. How are winners determined?

A. Although scholarships are competitive, keep in mind that you don't have to be the best student in your class to receive one. You simply need to be the best applicant who meets the qualifications for the scholarship.
