THE STEELTON-HIGHSPIRE JR./SR. HIGH SCHOOL will:

- I. Provide high quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participation of students to meet State student academic standards through an individual based growth model:**
 - Reading/Writing Intervention
 - Math Intervention
 - Study Skills
 - Positive Behavior Support
 - Scientific Research Based Curriculum for PA Academic Standards
 - Access to College & Career Readiness Standards
 - Student Regular Assessment with learning goals tied to assessment and individual student progress

- II. Hold parent-teacher conferences to discuss the student's achievement. Specifically those conferences will be held:**
 - October 24, 2019 & October 25, 2019 and March 19, 2020 & March 20, 2020
 - Provide skyping opportunities and phone conferences for parents that cannot make it to the conferences.
 - As determined by the grade level team
 - Per parent request with the student's teacher or counselor
 - Provide information to parents in alternative formats upon the request of parents with disabilities and to extend including a language the parent can understand

- III. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:**
 - Interim (progress reports)
 - Report Cards
 - E-mail
 - *Scheduled* conferences
 - Phone calls
 - Parent access to Power School
 - Provide each parent an individual student report regarding the performance of their child on the state assessment in math, reading and/or science and writing when applicable

IV. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows:

- Voice mail
- E-mail
- *Scheduled* conferences as requested
- *Scheduled* classroom visits (with 24 hour notice)

V. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class and to observe classroom activities, as follows:

- P.A.C. (Parent Advisory Council) meetings
- Special school events
- Assisting on field trips
- Clubs
- Cafeteria, reading, and special projects

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES: We as parents will support our children's learning in the following ways:

I. Do everything possible to provide a home environment that will encourage and stimulate learning by:

- Discuss what was learned at school each day
- Establish a set time for completing homework each day
- Model the importance of learning
- Provide positive reinforcement for academic achievement
- Foster a healthy respect for school
- Oversee that my child is reading each day
- Limit usage of electronics

II. Communicate regularly with my child's school and teacher by:

- Regularly communicate with the teacher, including conferences, *scheduled* classroom visits and phone calls
- Develop and maintain an open and positive relationship with the teacher
- Volunteer in school
- Review homework, report cards, progress reports and other forms of communication
- Attend school functions

III. Remind my child of the importance of discipline, especially self-discipline by:

- Review the Student Handbook
- Reinforce appropriate school behavior
- Emphasize the importance of being well prepared for school by having the necessary school supplies and completing homework assignments
- See that my child is wearing clothing that is dress code appropriate for school each day

- Review with my child their Positive Behavior Intervention Support (PBIS) plan, if applicable

IV. See to it that my child is in school every day as long as he/she is healthy. I understand the relationship between regular attendance and successful academic performance.
